## **PREFACE**

*We see small groups ("in home gatherings") both as a stepping stone toward eventually regathering as a larger group on July 18, and as a means to support faith both for those not yet comfortable with larger gatherings, and for those who have not yet joined, or cannot join with us in our facilities. As promised, our YouTube presence will continue, though modified in format, even as we will resume in person gatherings, if all goes well, in two weeks.*

*So, I urge you to gather at home, getting together with a few friends, this week and for the next several weeks.*

*How can we be comfortable with many if we are not comfortable with a few?*

*We must learn to walk before we can learn to run.*

*Small groups are an essential first step toward regathering as a larger group.*

*Prayerfully gather, and begin at your agreed upon time.*

*Again, this liturgy is not to constrain your worship experience, but to facilitate it.*

*Use it, adapt it, modify it as works best for you.*

*In your group, delegate the various liturgy parts to the various participants, as they are comfortable. Start with some prelude music to set the atmosphere. You may have cds or mp3s you would like to use. Maybe someone in your group is a musician, & can provide some prelude music.*

*Either are GREAT options. You will also find many possibilities in our YouTube playlists.*

*There are over 60 other hymns that have been placed in playlists "Hymns for Worship", and "Hymns by Carolyn Winfrey Gillette". So there are a number of alternatives for you to use beyond the suggestions you will find in this order of service.*

*There is also an anthem suggestion from Cathy, which may be used when you wish.*

*You may already have listened to it, and may wish to listen again.*

*Or maybe listen the first time this morning, or even later... your choice.*

*The first part of the liturgy will probably last less than 30 minutes.*

*Anything uncompleted may be returned to after the second part, again as you see fit.*

*Even though you will see me managing graphics, etc, I will be on in "live-stream" format at 9:30, rather than a pre-recorded video. Then at 11:00 we will gather via Zoom.*

*I will be praying for each and all of you as you gather for the first part of the liturgy.*

*Estimating participation during the pandemic continues to be strictly a guess.*

*You can help by letting me know the real numbers from your groups.*

*As mentioned previously we do have a "Re-Entering Well Task Force" working on the preparations which will allow us to meet together again in our facilities, and we will continue keep you posted on the progress.*

### **QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION**

Jesus charges his disciples to be vulnerable as he sends them out. The apostle Paul says that he embraces his vulnerability, “for whenever I am weak, then I am strong” (2 Cor. 12:10c).

In what ways might God be calling you to be vulnerable today?

Stuff distracts us. Useless clutter we think we cannot live without can be a burden: too many coats, shoes, garden tools, or mismatched kitchen storage containers with no lids in sight as they tumble out of overstuffed cabinets. Perhaps our clutter shows up in other ways: on a computer that has grown slow from processing too many useless files, or when our minds grow dull from too much Web surfing or television viewing.

Do you struggle with too much stuff?

How do Jesus’ words about traveling light challenge you to change the way you live?

How can you follow him more faithfully today?

### **MORNING PRAYERS:**

Loving God, as this day opens into new and untold possibility,  
purge me of my compulsive need to carry useless baggage—  
physically, mentally, or emotionally.

Teach me to walk simply with you as I trust in your abundant provision. Amen.

Fire of life, thank you for bringing me safely through the night.

As this new day dawns let me receive it as a gift and a blessing.

Open my mind and senses to be fully awake to you.

Attune my body to the rhythms of the day so that I can love and serve others as you guide me.

If I experience hardship or pain or if I am exposed to danger,  
send your Holy Spirit to help me to put my trust more fully in you.

Remind me that in life and in death I belong to you.

Let me walk gently on the earth, thankful for your providence and grace.

Let me dance joyfully with you, mindful that I share movement with planets and stars.

When the day is done and it is time to rest, grant that I can offer the day to you with thanksgiving.

I offer my prayer in the name of the Beloved Son, Jesus Christ the Lord. Amen.
